Prerequisite coursework evaluation policy:

- Applicants must complete a course audit form to demonstrate that all the prerequisite courses have been or will be completed prior to enrollment in the MAT program.
- An applicant can be accepted into the MAT program prior to the completion of all prerequisite courses. However, an applicant's enrollment in the MAT program will be contingent on completing all prerequisite courses with a "C" or better prior to the first day of class. Outstanding prerequisite courses will be noted in the applicant's acceptance letter. Applicants failing to achieve a "C" or better in all prerequisite courses will not be allowed to enroll in MAT coursework.
- Grades for courses completed outside the United State will be submitted to the Graduate School to calculate a grade equivalency.
- All prerequisite courses must be completed from an accredited institution. Grades for each prerequisite course must appear on at least one official transcript submitted by the applicant. Prerequisite courses not appearing on an official transcript from an accredited institution will not be accepted with a possible exception for medical terminology (See Below).
- If your institution does not offer a medical terminology course, a student may complete an online course from an accredited university resulting in a certificate of completion. The certificate of completion will be treated as a "C" for evaluation purposes.
- Prerequisite courses can be completed in person or online.
- Courses do not need to be taken at a specific level (e.g. 1000, 4000).
- Prerequisite courses do not need to have a specific title. However, the title of the course must make it evident that the prerequisite knowledge was included. In instances where the title does not make it clear that the prerequisite knowledge was addressed in the course, the program director will request a copy of the course's syllabus for review. From this review, the program director will make the determination if the course meets the programmatic standard. Applicants will be notified of the program director's decision via email within a month of submission.
